Website Gets A Makeover

Have you visited the Texas Twisters website lately? If you



haven't then you should surf on by and take a peek. The site has undergone something of a makeover. Just before our first performance at the Rodeo in Ft. worth, Dave handed off the webmaster duties to me, your brand new but ever so humble and demure webmaster: Tony a.k.a. CowboyDancer.

Just so everyone knows that this "ain't my first rodeo" I thought I'd tell you a bit about my web background. I've acquired quite a bit of experience working with web pages through my professional responsibilities as a Systems Librarian. I'm also an instructor with Amigos Library Services contracted to teach website design and HTML encoding to librarians across the state. I presented a session on website design at the Texas State Library Association convention last year that went so well that they've invited me back to conduct an all day workshop on the same topic this coming April.

Since becoming the Twisters webmaster, I've been busy creating a base set of graphic elements all designed to create a sense of "place," giving our website a clearly defined look. The design elements were created drawing heavily on those design elements present in our club logo. The base colors red, black and white are used throughout the site. Also, the twister and the Texas silhouettes have both been incorporated into the site design as bullets and as Java activated buttons. A neutral tan leather background balances the bolder colors and the logo and club description serve both as title and a graphic anchor on each page.

There are several sections to the site and a very good outline is in place indicating the type and scope of the information that will *eventually* be on the site. That information, including dance sheets, info on lessons and dancing in the DFW area, club info, archived newsletters, web links, a calendar of events and more, will be filled in gradually over the next couple weeks...which is where I need the help of my fellow Twisters:

For those of you who are not big line dance fans, give this routine a try, anyway--Rowdy (our dance coach) has choreographed a great routine that he is excited to share with the team. If you try it out and still can't get into it, don't worry, because we will be doing more couples routines in the near future.

I want to encourage EVERYONE (even new and interested dancers) to come to the first rehearsal on Dec. 4. Now that we've gotten our first routine learned and performed, it should be even more fun and exciting to start working on the second
